FIRE

Iceland - "The Land of the Gods" in Reykjavik

When the fires of Hekla began to burn in 1104, people around the world were terrified. Fear created stories about the powers of dark princes and the flames of eternal fires throwing souls into the underworld. Others spoke of immortal gods waging war on ancient battlefields.

Welcome to the ancient and the sacred in Iceland where you will journey into a landscape that brings you closer to the exotic within. It's fitting that this story begins with a swim in the Blue Lagoon - one of the 25 natural wonders of the world - and experience naturally heated geothermal, unnaturally blue mineral water kept at the constant perfect temperature between 34 and 39 degrees Celsius. Enjoy in-water massages rumoured to leave skin younger, with life-long lasting health benefits.

Rejuvenated, you're prepared for the thrill that is the tour inside the Thrihnukagigur volcano. That's right, inside. Open until mid-October you'll discover a whole new world an easy 45- to 50-minute hike inside. Watching its fire and fury brings a catharsis, of sorts. A natural letting off of steam that might speak to what you may need to purge. Other impressive sights nearby include the Gullfoss waterfall, and diving or snorkelling the Silfa fissure - one of the world's top dive spots, a crack between the North American and Eurasian tectonic plates.

After a trip by super jeep into "The Land of the Gods" in the island's interior, the domain of Vikings, elves and Norse Gods, enjoy a luxurious stay at slick, chic **101 Hotel** in Reykjavik. With a casually elegant style including log burning fires and a high-end spa, the property is within walking distance of the city's famed Golden Circle. Enjoy the hotel's glass ceiling restaurant for Icelandic international cuisine or take a stroll to experience the city's small-town feel at any one of several local restaurants. *101hotel.is*

Chile - the driest place on Earth, Atacama Desert

With regions that haven't seen rain in over 300 years and mountains capped with salt instead of snow, you quickly realise you're in one of the driest places on earth, where the arches of Valle de la Luna bring you one of the world's most unique sunrises. Although the Atacama Desert is an all-year destination, you will find the temperatures in November the most pleasing. The vast region stretches 965 kilometres south of the Peruvian border. Be sure to bring your walking shoes because this is a place that needs to be trekked to be believed.

According to NASA, you've just landed in the driest place on Earth, where some weather stations in this desert have never received rain, with soil samples that are similar to soil samples from Mars. Mummies that have been found here predate the Egyptians by thousands of years. Cycling salt flats, gushing over the Tatio geysers, or admiring explosive colours around the high Andean lagoons of Miscanti and Miñiques, these are mind-boggling encounters far drawn from daily realities.

When trekking turns to pampering, enjoy luxuriating at **Alto Atacama Desert Lodge & Spa** in San Pedro de Atacama. Chile's best architects, designers

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and landscapers unleashed this ethereal creation upon one of the world's most enchanting settings in the orange rock mountains, and it blends in perfectly. Water from glacial snow turns San Pedro de Atacama into an oasis and infuses the Puri Spa with an unequalled revitalising experience among the breathtaking beauty of a scorched landscape where you can enjoy unique treatments like a quinoa facial.

Astounding Chilean wines are the perfect counterpoint to the desert's enchantment, as are the culinary Mediterranean-inspired masterpieces enjoyed in intimate indoor and outdoor settings. Madagascar - Encounters at Nosy Hara Archipelago

One of Autumn's most enjoyable ecotourism destinations is Madagascar – all thanks to its gorgeous weather and many interesting ways to encounter nature, be it snorkelling the coral reefs or spotting a baby lemurs hitching rides on their mamma's backs.


Malagasy for "mountainous island" the archipelago gets its name from the signature stone formations of Nosy Hara, a region of twelve uninhabited islands encircled by coral reefs. Here among the azure sea you will find salt life at its best—exotic, eclectic and never in a hurry. In fact, you'll often hear "mora, mora" a Malagasy phrase that speaks to how everything needs its proper time. There is no regular boat traffic into the Nosy Hara, so a sail there is a slice of heaven, and requires some planning in advance. This remote locale provides unrivalled encounters with sea life including 279 species of coral fish, 108 species of coral, a variety of sponges, molluscs, marine turtles, whales, dolphins, birds, and 18 different reptiles including the smallest chameleon in the world - a rare, unique tropical paradise.

Constance Tsarabanjina, your sanctuary away from home, is infused with a warm Malagasy spirit and offers luxurious eco villas dotting exotic beaches, its own brand of barefoot chic. 

Borneo - Nature's playground takes centre stage

Borneo is a love letter to nature and her beautiful variety with the orangutan, the clouded leopard, pygmy elephant and proboscis monkey just to name a few of many species you might encounter here. A visit to Semenggok Orangutan Sanctuary finds an Orangutan enjoying a plump, wild durian. A wildlife safari along the Kinabatangan River invites you to journey deep into the heart of Borneo and enjoy your stay at the renowned **Borneo Rainforest Lodge**.

A luxurious rainforest chalet awaits with amenities to match. Enjoy a unique experience nestled in the jungle where nature takes centre stage and captivates day and night. The sounds of the topics inspire as the rhythm of the jungle tunes in to the rhythm of your heart. 
Wine lovers will enjoy romantic, historical wine tours through Benziger's biodynamic vineyards where there are plenty of intimate wine tastings. History comes alive at Buena Vista Winery, the oldest winery in California founded by Count Agoston Haraszthy after fleeing political persecution in search of Purple Gold during California's Gold Rush. Petroni Vineyard was the first and only winemaker to bring the Sangiovese Brunello di Montalcino clone to Sonoma from Italy, and the first to introduce food and wine pairings in the valley. Brainchild of Chef Max Porterkhamsky, delicacies - exquisitely served in voluminous wine caves - are inspired by his nomadic wanderings, a love of the stories behind local ingredients, and playful extremes like grilled peaches paired with fresh mozzarella in a micro-citrus balsamic reduction with home-grown estate olive oil.

Continue your flare for the luxurious and dramatic with a stay at the **Glass House**, the quintessential Sonoma Valley home, which appears to float above the tree line as if by magic providing storybook sunset views from every room. Elegant, modern, and minimal with touches of Asian artwork and accessories, guests enjoy the ultimate retreat among the property's outdoor spaces. Kenya - Airborne over Maasai Mara National Reserve

The romantic scale and breadth of wildlife here is the stuff of legend with epic backdrops found in dreams and movies. While wildlife spotting is year-round here, the vistas are the most spectacular during the wildebeest migration, billed as 'the greatest wildlife show on earth' which ends in October, coinciding with the end of the dry season. One of the most beautiful ways to see the migration is in a hot





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air balloon. From the commanding perspective of the clouds, you will understand nature and your place in it in new ways as your spirit soars to new heights.

You will get to experience all of this from a luxury tent that harkens to the refined elegance of a bygone era. **Angama Mara**, inspired by the Swahili word for "suspended in mid-air" is a fitting base camp for your hot air balloon safari.
